What are VET Student Loan and FEE-HELP

FEE-HELP is a federal loan program for eligible students. It provides a low-interest loan to help cover the cost of education. Financial Options

There are two options available to students who are unable to pay their tuition fees. The first option is the Course Assurance option, which allows students to continue their studies for one semester without paying tuition fees. The second option is the Tuition Fee Repayment option, which allows students to repay their tuition fees over a period of up to 10 years.

1. The Course Assurance option:

This option allows students to continue their studies for one semester without paying tuition fees. It is available to students who are unable to pay their tuition fees due to financial hardship. Students who choose this option will not receive a refund of their tuition fees for the semester they are unable to pay.

2. The Tuition Fee Repayment option:

This option allows students to repay their tuition fees over a period of up to 10 years. It is available to students who are unable to pay their tuition fees due to financial hardship. Students who choose this option will receive a refund of their tuition fees for the semester they are unable to pay.

 Unlawful discrimination, harassment, and retaliation are prohibited by Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and the Equal Pay Act of 1963.

Unlawful Discrimination, Harassment, Retaliation

- ▶ **Unlawful Discrimination**
 Unlawful discrimination is the treatment of an individual differently because of a protected characteristic.
- ▶ **Harassment**
 Harassment is a form of unlawful discrimination that involves a pattern of behavior that is intended to or has the effect of intimidating, humiliating, or creating a hostile work environment.

- ▶ **Retaliation**
 Retaliation is the act of punishing an individual for exercising their legal rights.

Unlawful Discrimination, Harassment, Retaliation

Unlawful discrimination is prohibited by Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967, the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and the Equal Pay Act of 1963.

Education and Other Legislation Amendment Act (No.1) 2017
